## This Time In History

**November 11, 1918 -** World War I ended on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. The armistice between the Allies and Germany was signed, marking a major moment in world and U.S. history.

**November 19, 1863 -** President Abraham Lincoln delivered his famous speech at the dedication of the Soldiers' National Cemetery in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. It's one of the most iconic speeches in American history.

**December 1, 1955 -** Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat to a white passenger in Montgomery, Alabama. Her arrest led to a year-long boycott and became a pivotal moment in the Civil Rights Movement.

**December 16, 1773 -** American colonists, protesting British taxation, dumped 342 chests of tea into Boston Harbor. This act of defiance helped ignite the American Revolution.

**December 6, 1865 -** The 13th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, officially abolishing slavery in the United States.

## Spotlight on Board Member Jetta Schmidt:

A Life of Grace, Resilience, and Service

Georgette Lora Schmidt, known to all as Jetta, was born in Heidelberg, Germany in 1945. Her life has been marked by courage, compassion, and an enduring love for dance and people.

Jetta's story begins generations earlier, when her great-grandfather left Austria in the late 1800s to work in Russia. Her grandmother, a strong and resourceful woman, fled Russia with her five children during WWII as the German advance made life perilous. They eventually resettled in Heidelberg, a place Jetta remembers fondly for its beauty and safety.

Growing up in a multi-generational household, Jetta was raised by her grandmother, affectionately called Baba, alongside her mother and two aunts. Despite the hardships, she recalls a happy childhood filled with love and laughter. At age 7, inspired by her ballerina aunt, Jetta began ballet. Though she dreamed of tap dancing, ballet instilled in her discipline and grace, qualities that shaped her life.





After ten years of applying for refugee status, a church in New York sponsored her family's immigration to the U.S. On February 14, 1956, four women and two children arrived in New York Harbor, greeted by the Statue of Liberty, a symbol of hope and freedom. Jetta was just 10½ years old.

The transition to America was bittersweet. Leaving behind friends and familiarity was traumatic, but the promise of a new life was powerful. After four years in New York, the family moved to sunny California, where Jetta attended junior and high school in Los Angeles and Hollywood.



It was there she met her future husband, Orville Schmidt, who moved in next door. Their love story began with a Valentine's Day date in 1963 and a whirlwind elopement that November. Jetta graduated from John Marshall High School in January 1964 and soon began working as a policy typist for an insurance company.

Jetta and Orville built a beautiful life together, welcoming two daughters and a son. In 1973, after an earthquake damaged their home, they decided to relocate. Though the story goes they threw a dart at a map and landed on Boise, it may have been fate that led them to a community they've cherished for nearly five decades.

Jetta has worn many hats, insurance worker, china painter, bank employee, translator, but her most rewarding roles were in volunteer work. She spent 22 years helping in 1st and 3rd grade classrooms at Horizon Elementary, earning the

Jefferson Award for her dedication. In 2008, she served as a translator and host for the Russian-speaking Special Olympics team from Kyrgyzstan, a deeply moving experience.

After Orville's passing in 2017, Jetta found healing through Christian poetry and the support of her family, church, and senior center community. She joined the Meridian Senior Center with her dear friend and neighbor of 51 years, Janice, continuing her legacy of service. 3 years after joining our Center, Jetta joined the Board of Directors.

Jetta is a proud mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother to three great-granddaughters—with one more on the way. She describes herself as shy, though her warmth and openness suggest otherwise. Her husband used to say, "Jetta never met a stranger, just a new friend."

We are honored to have Jetta Schmidt as part of our Board and our lives.
